GACC Statement on the Marijuana Opportunity Reinvestment and Expungement (MORE) Act

The Global Alliance for Cannabis Commerce (GACC) is proud to announce its support of House Judiciary Chairman Jerrold Nadler (D-NY) and Senator Kamala Harris' (D-CA) Marijuana Opportunity Reinvestment and Expungement (MORE) Act.

The Act takes the important steps of both de-scheduling cannabis entirely from the Controlled Substances Act and works to make restitution for the damages of cannabis prohibition to minority communities.

The GACC looks forward to working with the bill sponsors as it moves forward through the legislative process to clarify the treatment of cannabis in interstate commerce.

According to GACC Executive Director Randal John Meyer:

“It is an incredible step forward in cannabis reform when the Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee is advancing a de-scheduling bill that makes restitution to the communities most harmed by the policies of cannabis prohibition. The time to end the policy of prohibition is sooner rather than later, and doing so in a comprehensive fashion with a baseline of removing cannabis from the controlled substances list is essential for the growth of industry and full access to financial and international markets.”
